"The Downland Dawdle"

Supplementary Regulations

The 750 Motor Club on behalf of the Inter-Register Club will organise a Navigational Scatter Rally based at The Pot Kiln, Frilsham, Berks (GR 552731 Map 174) on the edge of the Berkshire Downs

The event will be a round of the 2010 Inter-Register Club Championship.

The meeting will be governed by the General Regulations of the RAC Motor Sports Association, the supplementary regulations and any written instructions that are issued by the club.
MSA Permit 120740.

The event is open to pre-1941 cars entered by fully elected members of clubs comprising the Inter-Register Club. All cars must display a current tax disc and have a current MOT certificate for inspection at scrutineering. Entrants should ensure that their insurance will cover them for this type of event.

The maximum entry will be 30. The organisers reserve the right to cancel the event should less than 12 entries be received. Entries open on publication of these Regulations and close on August 16th. Entries must be on the official entry form and include the appropriate payment. Late entries may well be accepted and paid for on the day if advised by phone first.

Entrants will require OS Landranger map 174, version C2 was used during preparation but any recent editions should suffice. A roamer, pencils, rubber, ruler, protractor, compass and clipboards will also be required. Car identification numbers will be provided.

Entrants will be expected to visit a maximum of 16 out of 24 locations defined by varied navigational means and to answer a simple question. These will be weighted according to their difficulty. To complete the event you will need to drive about 50 miles.

There will be three classes, Beginners, Novices and Experts. Any crew member who has won a class award or better, in an IRC or VSCC rally in the last 5 years, is defined as an Expert Crew. Beginners are those on their first Navigational Rally and will receive additional assistance with plotting. Novices are everyone else. In addition entries are invited from people not wishing to do any complicated plotting who will be provided with a marked map showing where the questions can be answered. The map will also show suitable hostelrys along the way that might offer sustenance. This is the Touring Class. Anyone opting for this will only qualify as a 'Starter' for IRC Championship points.

There will be awards to 1st, 2nd and 3rd places overall, to the best team as well to the overall winner of each class. The winning team comprises the three highest placed cars of a single marque.

The Rally Fee will include tea/coffee and biscuits at the start for a crew of 2. At the finish there will be an optional buffet of sandwiches, cakes etc with tea/coffee @£6.50 to be paid for in advance.
